## **Important Highlights**

### 9. **International**

- a. IMF approved an **emergency loan of \$1.4 billion** for Pakistan.
- b. China **revises its figures in Wuhan, adding 1290 deaths** which is 50 % additional from the previous figure.
- c. California Governor Newsom said that until there is herd immunity and a vaccine is developed, the **likelihood of the state going back to normal is unlikely.**
- d. **Britain's economy could shrink by 13%** (more than any annual fall since WW II) in 2020 in the case of a **three-month coronavirus lockdown.**
- e. **US President announced phased lowering restrictions** on movement and social interaction in US states.
- f. **Germany will ease corona virus shutdown** from next week. **World trying to move back towards normalcy.**

### 10. **National**

- a. Pakistan has **requested China for easing in payment obligations** of over \$30 billion worth of about 12,000-megawatt power projects under CPEC project to **minimize financial and economic affects** under COVID environment.
- b. The **State Bank of Pakistan reduced the interest rate to 9%** to help businesses and people. **Measure will have positive impact on growth and employment and would also ensure economic activity.**
- c. Decision by **G-20 countries to give debt relief** to developing countries will have substantial impact on Pakistan, **allowing a much needed fiscal space to focus on COVID-19.**
- d. **PM expressed grief over loss of lives of Pakistanis** living abroad due to COVID-19.
