


### Clinical Status of COVID









### Heat Map

## 1. International

- a. **India crosses 4 million coronavirus cases** with record surge.
- b. **COVID-19 has forced closure of a dozen schools in mainland France** just days into the new academic year, as coronavirus cases surge in parts of the country.
- c. **Brazil's economic ministry revised its 2020 fiscal forecasts to account for the extension of emergency payments** to the poor through the end of the year, which will push government and public sector deficits out to new records.
- d. **DG WHO has called for countries around the world to join forces to tackle the coronavirus** and said that "vaccine nationalism" would only slow the response to the pandemic.
- e. **Doctors in turkey have said that surging COVID cases in Ankara are stretching hospitals to their limit** and Turkish authorities need to impose a fresh lockdown to bring the virus under control.
- f. **University of Washington's health institute predicted that US deaths from the coronavirus will reach 410,000 by the end of the year and deaths could jump to 3,000 per day in December.**
- g. **South Korea reported 168 new COVID cases in the last 24 hours**, posting the lowest daily tally in three weeks after imposing stricter social distancing rules to stop a second wave of infections.
- h. **Gaza has reported hundreds of coronavirus infections since the first case emerged in the general population last week**, and a UN aid group has cautioned that a lack of key medical items including ventilators could make it hard to treat the disease effectively.
- i. **Cuba has rolled out red carpet for first planeload of tourists to arrive on the Communist-run island in months** as it struggles toward a post- COVID pandemic new normalcy.
- j. **Johnson & Johnson will seek 20,000 volunteers for late-stage human trials of its experimental coronavirus vaccine** in hard-hit Latin America.

## 2. National

- a. Federal Minister for Planning and Development Asad Umar said **Pakistan's success against Covid-19 has been recognized worldwide.**
- b. Federal Education Ministry has **declared Saturday as a working day in all federal educational institutions for the current year.**
- c. **At least 23 tourists amongst 35 people tested positive for coronavirus in Gilgit-Baltistan, taking the region's tally to 2,987.**
- d. Islamabad, Gilgit-Baltistan and Azad Jammu and Kashmir have collectively reported **31 virus cases over the last 24 hours.** No new deaths were reported during this period.
